

L.P. MILLER COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL – AWARDS 2020 -2021



Many local, provincial and national awards are available to L.P. Miller students. Awards may be in the form of books, plaques, trophies, awards, scholarships or bursaries.

Financial awards are of several basic kinds:

1. Scholarships

- Based largely on high academic achievement (usually 80% or higher)
- In addition to high academic achievement, many scholarships are also based on school and community involvement.

2. Bursaries

- Based primarily on financial need. Other factors such as character, academics, volunteer work or extra-curricular involvement may play a part.
- Not necessarily awarded to the person with the highest average

2. Awards

- Sometimes the generic term “award” is used. Awards may be based on any criteria set out by the donors.

L.P. Miller students are very fortunate. Individuals, clubs, associations and businesses in our community are well known for their generous recognition of our graduates through these many different awards. Some awards require applications while some awards are presented automatically to deserving individuals based on performance and enrollment in a particular program.

LOCAL AWARDS – APPLICATIONS REQUIRED

HOW TO APPLY FOR THESE LOCAL AWARDS:

- a. **Read through this booklet, and decide which awards that you qualify for.**

You can request applications for these awards by circling the corresponding number or the “pink” Application Order Form.

Hand this pink Application Order Form into Mrs. Boulet in the Main Office. She will then gather the applications that you have requested and will return them to you within 48 hours.

- b. **Complete each application. Please be sure to attach all information requested for each award. DO NOT add any documents that are not requested. BE CAREFUL. They must be STAPLED together when you hand them in. Please do not put in envelopes or folders. CHECK THEM OVER!**
- c. **APRIL 30TH IS THE DEADLINE FOR MOST OF THESE AWARDS !** Please hand completed applications into Mrs. Boulet in the Main Office at L.P. Miller School.

- 1 @ \$250.00

- Must be graduating from L.P. Miller Comprehensive School in the year of application
- be furthering their education as a full time student in a trade or industrial program at a recognized technical institute in the year following graduation.
- have a mark of 80% or higher in grade 11 or 12 Welding Course
- have a mark of 80% or higher in a grade 11 or 12 Machining Course
- Need transcript with midterm marks

***2021 Diamond North Credit Union Member Scholarships (Grade 12 only)**

(Awards may be claimed up to 16 months from the date the Scholarship is Announced, and a request for extension may be requested)

3. **Knights of Columbus Scholarships (Grade 12 or 1st year post-secondary within 2 years following graduation).**
 - 4 @ \$500.00

- For first year university, technical or other post-secondary program approved by the selection committee
- Based on school and community involvement, career goals, church involvement and need

4. Mildred Owens Memorial Scholarship (Grade 12 & past grads entering 1st year of Education program)

- Amount Varies (Approximately 1 @ \$50.00 – \$100.00)
- To graduate or past grad of L.P. Miller who attends the College of Education at the University of Saskatchewan, or who attends a Teacher Training Program in another institution recognized by the U of S...for example the University of Regina.
- Based on 50% scholastic achievement, 20% need 10% involvement in student government, student extra-curricular activities, community organizations and community service work.

5. Misselbrook Scholarships (Grade 12's and graduates of LPM after 1978)

- Several at varying amounts from approximately \$200.00 - \$1,500.00
- Number awarded will vary, depending on interest rates.
- For technical institutions or universities in Saskatchewan
- If you don't apply in your grade 12 year, you may come back and apply in later years.

6. Nipawin and District Chamber of Commerce Bursary (Grade 12 only)

- \$500.00
- Specifically for students entering full time post-secondary schooling in business or a business related program (i.e./ commerce, accounting, etc.)
- Based on academic achievement

7. Nipawin Bridge Magazine Bursary (Grade 12 only)

- Must be entering full time program at a recognized post-secondary institution within 16 months of graduation
- Based on primarily on financial need
- Must demonstrate a record of positive school/community involvement
- Must be graduating from L.P. Miller Comprehensive School in the year of application
- Will defer payment up to 16 months

- 1 @ \$1000.00 (presented after Feb. 1st with proof of enrollment)
- For an industrial or trade program at a technical institution
- Based on academic standing, school and community involvement, financial need and other information on application form

15. Nipawin School of Dance (Grade 12 only)

- 1 @ \$200.00
- To a current L.P. Miller Grade 12 student
- Based on school and community involvement, leadership, involvement in the arts (dance, music, drama, voice or art)
- Letter of reference, transcript and statement of community involvement

16. Lake Country Co-op Scholarships (Grade 12 only)

- 2 @ \$500.00 (1 Technical & 1 University)
- Based on marks, extra-curricular activities, leadership
- Letter of reference, marks, leadership and related factors
- May defer if you include a letter requesting deferral when you apply.

17. Lake Country Co-op High School Spirit & Dedication Scholarship (Grade 12 only)

- 1 @ \$500.00
- Open to all Grade 12 students attending L.P. Miller School who are registered in any approved post-secondary program – University, Technical School, Community College, Truck Driver 1A Training, Paramedic Training etc.
- For a student who displays the spirit of working hard, doing your best, who is supportive and respectful of your peers, teachers, community members, achieving the best academic results that you are capable of (must have passing grades)
- Transcript with midterm marks
- May defer if you include a letter requesting deferral when you apply.

- Based on being a student of good standing who is involved in extracurricular activities and who has performed volunteer work, 3 references: 1 personal, 1 academic, 1 employer (if applicable) and letter of acceptance to post-secondary

19. Royal Purple Bursaries (Grade 12 only) *waiting on confirmation*

- 4 @ \$500.00
- for students attending a recognized university, college or technical program

- Based school participation, community involvement, positive character traits, general deportment, a need for financial support and finally, academic standing, although not a major basis for the award.
- Will defer for up to 12 months if a letter of permission is submitted after you are granted the award.

20. Saskatchewan Union of Nurses Bursary (S.U.N. Local # 5) (Grade 12 & Past Graduates)

- 1 @ \$500.00
- Grad or former grad from Nipawin, Carrot River, Arborfield, Zenon Park or Choiceland
- Must be entering Saskatchewan Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing @ Saskatchewan Polytechnic (**Direct Entry**) or be **fully accepted into the College of Nursing at the University of Saskatchewan**. (Arts and Science Pre-Nursing students do not qualify.)
- Financial need will be taken into consideration

- Must have taken Law 30 and demonstrated an interest and aptitude for law; **OR** Be entering a field of study related to the practice of law, law enforcement, or the provision of legal services (i.e. RCMP or City Police, Conservation, Social Work, Justice Studies, Legal Assistant, plan to apply for law, Community Corrections, etc...)

- Will defer for up to 12 months

PROVINCIAL & NATIONAL AWARDS

Throughout the school year, Mrs. Christiansen advertises various provincial and national scholarships, bursaries, and awards opportunities via noon announcements. The tips provided below are included here a second time as a reminder of potential award opportunities.

Financial assistance for post-secondary education can be obtained from many sources: employers, unions, associations, or organizations that students or parents belong to. For example, students who are relatives or descendants of war veterans or students who

choose particular schools (e.g. Sask Polytechnic, University of Saskatchewan, and University of Regina) have financial assistance opportunities open specifically to them. YOUR UNIQUE FAMILY BACKGROUND MAY PROVIDE YOU WITH OPPORTUNITIES FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE NOT AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC. TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THESE UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES!!

1. List possible sources of financial aid by brainstorming family history – occupations, club and association memberships. Inquire if the employers, groups/associations that you or your family members belong to, offer scholarships that you may qualify for.

2. Find scholarship information posted on our L.P. Miller School website. Here you will find a variety of tips on how to apply for scholarships, **STUDENT LOANS** information, and the last 7 pages of this online document contain links to numerous provincial and national scholarships.

3. **Living Sky School Division Career Guidance Blog.** Go to <http://mclurgcareerguidance.blogspot.ca/> An excellent blog. Full of good information. Many of the scholarships and much of the post-secondary information listed on this blog applies to students across all Saskatchewan School Divisions. A few of them are specific only to the Living Sky School Division so those ones would not apply to our North East School Division students. If you have questions about any of the information on this blog, please see Mrs. Christiansen.

4. Spend time at noon hour, after school, or in a spare, looking through the “**red scholarship binder**” that is kept in the Student Services office. Scholarship information that is mailed to the school is kept in this binder. You may not sign this binder out, but if you find something that you would like to apply for, ask Mrs. Christiansen or Mrs. Boulet to make a copy for you.

7. Miscellaneous Tips

- Surf the Web (with a critical eye) If you know the name of a scholarship, often all you have to do is “Google it” and your online search may lead you to the actual application.
- Big corporations often offer scholarships. If you look on the website of big agricultural , manufacturing, business corporations, you may find a scholarship link
- If your parents work for a Union or larger company, they may offer scholarships to children of their employees. If you work for a larger company, they may offer scholarships to their employees.
- Churches and other organizations your parents may be affiliated with sometimes offer scholarships. (Many of these are already part of the local awards that will be presented to you at the Grade 12 Local Awards Meeting)
