Purpose:

The Counselling Consultant provides strength based behaviour focused counselling services to students who are experiencing challenges that may impede success at school.

Required Education, Knowledge, Qualifications and Experience:

- A Bachelor' Degree in Social Work, Psychology or equivalent
- A Master's degree in a related field will be considered an asset
- Possess a current and valid Driver's License
- Experience working in the learning sector within a collaborative-consultative model would be an asset
- Proficiency in the operation of computers, word processing applications and additional software comparable to those currently used in the school division.

Required Skills and Abilities:

- Ability to maintain strict confidentiality
- Ability to prioritize multiple demands and effectively manage time
- Ability to work as a team player
- Ability to establish a strong rapport with students, families and school personnel
- Ability to manage high stress situations
- Ability to write reports requiring meaningful interpretations of data, accuracy, readability and editorial correctness
- Effective communication and presentation skills
- Ability to handle physically/emotionally demanding children
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- A positive attitude and work ethic
- Effective organizational and record keeping skills

Supervision of Other Staff:

This position does not involve the direct supervision of staff.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Without restricting the generality of the purpose above, the Counselling Consultant shall perform such duties and responsibilities as may be assigned including but not restricted to the following:

- Participate as an active member of the Student Support Services team in carrying out the NESD vision and mission
- Respond to student needs as outlined in the NESD Response to Instruction (RtI) service delivery model
- Consult and collaborate with school personnel on matters relating to program materials, behaviour management and emotional support for individual students
- The Behavioural Consultant will affect positive behavioral change by observing student behavior in homes and schools and conducting brief functional behavior assessments



- There will be a focus on collaboratively developing behavior support plans
- The Behavioural Consultant will help implement behaviour support plans by modelling and reinforcing recommended strategies
- The Behavioural Consultant will actualize Tier 3 interventions. In addition, the Behaviour Consultant will focus on building a consistent behavioural response between home and school.
- This support will be intensive, frequent and of a 90 day or less duration.
- The Behavioural Consultant will also assist schools to build capacity with Tier 2 behavioural interventions.
- The facilitation of partnerships with other service providers will also be a focus in order respond to the whole child.
- Caseload will be prioritized based on intensity of need with crisis situations requiring immediate attention. This will be done in conjunction with the Coordinator of Student Support Services and Coordinator of Integrated School Services
- Provide workshops and in services in areas of expertise to school personnel when requested
- Be knowledgeable and supportive of applicable Division Operational Policies & Procedures
- Be willing to engage in life-long learning with respect to training and professional development
- Conduct oneself in a manner appropriate to a professional learning environment
- Deal tactfully with staff, students, parents and the public
- Performs additional duties as assigned by the Coordinator of Integrated School Services

Judgment, Independence and Client/Peer Contact:

Confidentiality

At no time should a Counselling Consultant discuss, in public, information pertaining to a student. A Counselling Consultant is expected to respect the confidential nature of the position by avoiding discussion about any topics that are not formally communicated to the public by the administration of the school or the school division. Any breach of confidentiality in this regard is a serious violation of acceptable professional conduct.

Independence

The Counselling Consultant is expected to work independently and as a team member of both the school-based and division staff.

Client/Peer Contact

This position involves working collegially with other support staff, teachers, parents and school-based administration on a daily basis in support of the goals of the school.

Responsibility for Quality of Assigned Work:

The employee is under direct supervision and is responsible to achieve the quality of work as assigned by the supervisor.
